Jeff Jackson, Vice-Moderator, called the meeting to order.

Sandra Johnson welcomed everyone to Gretna Baptist Church for the Executive Committee Meeting.

Jeff led in a devotional taken from Jeremiah 17:5-8 and prayed.

Jeff presented the agenda for the meeting.

Jeff presented the October 6, 2020 Annual Meeting minutes, and they were approved.

Jeff presented the Treasurer's Reports for September 2020 through December 2020, and they were approved.

### **Reports**

#### **Administration & Leadership Team:**

On behalf of the A&L Team, Associational Mission Strategist (AMS) Jerry R. Chumley reported that the team did not have a quorum of its members present at the meeting and, therefore, were unable to vote on a team facilitator.

Jerry presented the following recommendations:

Invite Rev. Tim Rhoads to speak at the Annual Meeting on October 5, 2021, with Dr. Tommy Green as alternate. A motion was made by Jackie Sharpton and seconded by Richard Massey to approve this recommendation. The motion was carried.

Approve Matthew 11:28 as the theme for the Annual Meeting on October 5, 2021. A motion was made by Cephus Phillips and seconded by Jackie Sharpton to approve this recommendation. The motion was carried.

### Evangelism & Missions Team:

There was no team report.

WMU Leader Susie Tipton reported that the WMU may meet in March or April, but a final decision has not been made yet.

Susie reported that the WMU sent gifts and food to Riverchase for the Christmas Party, and she added that churches have made donations of applesauce for several months.

She encouraged all the churches to support the Maguire State Mission Offering in September. She highlighted Pine Grove Baptist Church’s “great mission work.” She is working on the WMU Fall Meeting in September, possibly at Greensboro First Baptist Church. The Annual Mission Banquet will be November 16 at Thomas Memorial Baptist Church, Scott Carter from Celebration Baptist Church in Tallahassee will be the speaker.

### **Richard Massey – Disaster Relief**

Reported that Disaster Relief training took place earlier this year in May and June. The closest training to us was in Perry, and he didn’t know of anyone who attended. He is going to try to have some training locally. He reported that State Disaster Relief Leader Delton Beall retired, and David Coggins has taken his position. He noted that for now, in our association, the focus would be on local missions, which would be limited to a week or a weekend. Dr. Eric Erskine, Moderator, called the meeting to order.

A motion was made that the messengers present and those to come be seated. The motion was seconded and carried.

A motion was made that the printed program be adopted to constitute the order of business. The motion was seconded and carried.

Dr. Eric Erskine, Moderator, welcomed everyone to the 60<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting of the Gadsden County Baptist Association (GCBA).

Dr. Eric Erskine, Moderator, took his devotional from 1 Corinthians 4:1-2. He spoke of the role and calling of pastors. Pastors are the servants of Christ and stewards of the mystery (message of the gospel). It is required that pastors remain faithful. Church members are to follow the pastor if he is trustworthy in order to learn and grow with him. He closed the devotional with prayer.

Rev. Jerry R. Chumley, Associational Mission Strategist (AMS), welcomed new pastors: Rev. Bobby Waynick - Pastor of Santa Clara Baptist Church (not present at this time but was recognized later in the meeting), Rev. Curtis Alston - Pastor of Greensboro First Baptist Church, Rev. Isaiah del Pilar - Pastor of Thomas Memorial Baptist Church (not present at this time but was recognized during the worship service).

Rev. Jerry R. Chumley, AMS, recognized all the pastors in attendance at the business session: Rev. Curtis Alston - Pastor of Greensboro First Baptist Church, Dr. Eric Erskine - Pastor of Havana First Baptist Church, Rev. John Forsman - Pastor of Pine Grove Baptist Church, Rev. Warren Fox - Pastor of Chattahoochee First Baptist Church, Rev. Jeff Jackson - Pastor of Quincy First Baptist Church, Rev. Frederick March - Pastor of New Canaan Baptist Church, Rev. Mark Moore - Pastor of Calvary Baptist Church, Rev. Cephus Phillips - Pastor of Providence Baptist Church, Rev. Bobby Waynick - Pastor of Santa Clara Baptist Church (Rev. Ward Bradley - Pastor of Riverside Baptist Church & Rev. Isaiah del Pilar - Pastor of Thomas Memorial Baptist Church came in later).

Rev. Jerry R. Chumley, AMS, recognized the churches represented by messengers at the business session: Beulah Hill Missionary Baptist Church, Calvary Baptist Church, Chattahoochee First Baptist Church, Greensboro

Rev. Jerry R. Chumley, AMS, noted that with the number (12) of churches represented by messengers' present (6 churches required for quorum) that the business of the GCBA could be conducted as presented.

Dr. Eric Erskine, Moderator, presented the minutes of the August 3, 2021 GCBA Executive Committee Meeting. A motion was made and seconded that the minutes be approved. The motion carried.

He referred to his report which will be included in the GCBA Book of Reports.

##### **Moderator's Report – Dr. Eric Erskine:**

He stated that he is encouraged by the renewal of like-minded cooperation that we are seeing. The hard work of our Associational Mission Strategist is bearing fruit in many ways. The monthly pastors' fellowships have

Dr. Eric Erskine, Moderator, presented a resolution expressing appreciation to Greensboro First Baptist Church for hosting the GCBA 2021 Annual Meeting. A motion was made and seconded to adopt this resolution. The motion carried.

There was no other business.

A motion was made to adjourn. The motion was seconded and carried. Rev. Frederick March, Pastor of New Canaan Baptist Church, prayed the benediction/blessing.

Thirteen members were present: Rev. Curtis Alston, Rev. Jerry R. Chumley, Larry Curtis, Dr. Eric Erskine, Rev. Warren Fox, Rev. Jeff Jackson, Sandra Johnson, Lavinia Radel, Jackie Sharpton, Susie Tipton, Rev. Frederick March, Kimble Mulford, and Virginia Whigham.

Seven churches were represented: Chattahoochee First, Greensboro First, Gretna, Havana First, New Canaan, Quincy First, and Riverside.

The meeting was called to order by Dr. Eric Erskine, Moderator. He shared a devotional taken from Luke 1:1-4. He stated that these verses connect with the Christmas story due to Luke's desire to give an orderly account of the promises/prophecies being fulfilled at Christmas so we can hold to our faith with absolute certainty. He then led in prayer.

Mike Gresham, representative of Gideons International, spoke. The Gideon State Convention will be held in Tallahassee in 2022. He encouraged all area churches to have a Gideon presence on Sunday, May 22, 2022. He invited all pastors to attend the Pastor Appreciation Banquet on Friday, May 20, 2022 at 7:00 PM at the Tucker Civic Center in Tallahassee. (Mike was accompanied by Hunter Page.)

A motion was made and seconded to approve the agenda for today's meeting. The motion carried.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes for the Annual Meeting on October 5, 2021. The motion carried.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the Treasurer's Reports for September and October 2021. The motion carried. (It was noted that \$5,150 was given for "Mission: Dignity.")

### **TEAM REPORTS:**

#### **Administration and Leadership - Facilitator Rev. Warren Fox:**

The Association received a letter from the IRS stating that GCBA owed taxes for the quarter ending on September 30, 2020. After attempting calls to the IRS but being unable to get through, proof that the taxes had been paid on time was mailed to the IRS. The IRS then sent a second letter stating the taxes had to be paid in order to prevent a penalty and interest being added to the amount owed. Treasurer Howard McKinnon recommended that GCBA pay the amount the IRS claims is owed. Paying the amount twice caused Line Item 402-2 in the budget to be exceeded. A motion from the A&L Team was made to amend the budget by \$540.95



to cover this expense. It was noted that another letter came this week from the IRS stating that a decision on the amount owed will be made within 60 days. The motion carried.

After the AMS reported that Virginia Whigham and Erin Peschl have the GCBA website at gadsdencountybaptistassoc.com up and running, the A&L Team made a motion to take the expense page of the financial report off the website. The motion carried.

The A&L Team made a motion to approve the 2022 GCBA Calendar. One change was made: WMU Spring Meeting on March 8 at Chattahoochee First Baptist Church was added. The motion as amended carried.

### **Evangelism & Missions – No report**

#### **WMU/Women’s Ministries - Director Susie Tipton:**

She thanked Thomas Memorial Baptist Church for hosting the Mission Banquet on Tuesday, November 16. She said, “It was a great success and the food was exceptional.” Rev. Scott Carter, Mission Pastor of Celebration Baptist Church in Tallahassee, and his wife spoke. They focused on the Great Commission.

At least eight churches participated in gathering needed items for Riverchase Nursing Home. These items included stuffed animals, hats, socks, and hygiene products. Refreshments and party fixings were left for the nursing home to give the residents a Christmas party. She said, “They were very pleased to receive them. We plan to have a Valentine Party for them inside.”

She noted that it was time for the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for International Missions. She said, “I’m hearing that large amounts are being given.”

### **Miscellaneous Business**

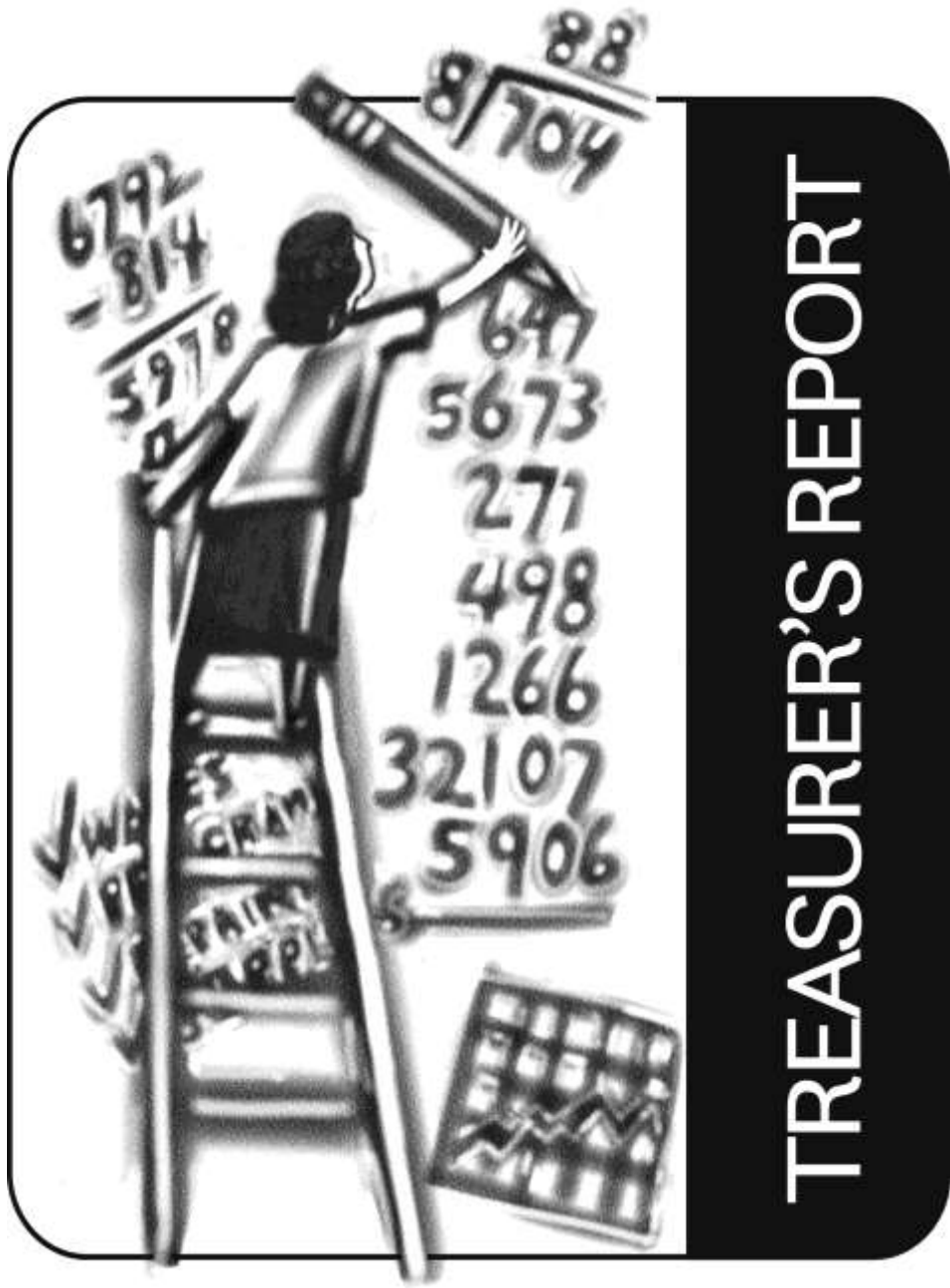

## AMS JERRY R. CHUMLEY – ANNUAL REPORT 2021

On Tuesday, October 6, 2020, we gathered at Thomas Memorial Baptist Church (TMBC) for the Gadsden County Baptist Association (GCBA) Annual Meeting. The Meeting was different due to the coronavirus pandemic. We started with our usual business session, but no fellowship meal followed. (How I always look forward to those times of gathering around the table!) After we conducted the business of GCBA, we entered into a time of worship. Dr. Craig Conner, Pastor of Panama City First Baptist Church, preached a powerful message in which he challenged us to do evangelism. I left that night inspired but extremely uncertain of what the future had in store for us. Some GCBA events were cancelled (including the Annual Pastor Appreciation Banquet although a generous Christmas gift was given to all of the pastors in our association thanks to assistance from the Florida Baptist Convention), and others were not even scheduled. Similar decisions were being made in all of our churches. Even the Florida Baptist Convention (FBC) Annual Meeting was cancelled. Fear was widespread, and our lives were seemingly put on hold. Then, word came at the end of 2020 that vaccinations for COVID-19 would soon be available. Maybe, at last, this would be the light at the end of this dark tunnel. We held our first GCBA Executive Committee Meeting of 2021 on February 9 at Gretna Baptist Church and began to at least talk about getting together again. In the spring, it looked like we had turned a corner in the battle with the coronavirus. Case numbers were down along with hospitalizations and, most importantly, deaths. However, the war was not over. Disagreements concerning the vaccinations developed, and coronavirus variants began to appear. The GCBA Church Support Team decided to go forward with a planned Senior Adult Luncheon at Quincy First Baptist Church (QFBC) on Thursday, July 1. We were not sure what to expect given the COVID situation, but I was hoping for about 60 people to attend. Instead, we had at least 108 present for a wonderful meal (thank you, Rev. Jeff Jackson and team and QFBC) and an encouraging program presented by Rev. Tim Rhoads, Pastor of Blountstown First Baptist Church (by the way, his home church is QFBC). Things were looking up; things were about to return to normal. As the summer continued, coronavirus numbers began to increase dramatically. Again, many hopes were dashed or delayed. Decisions were made to “wait-and-see” before engaging in a full calendar of events. We did go forward with a “Tax Update/Stewardship Conference” on Tuesday, September 21, at TMBC (thank you, Gary Dawson and team and TMBC). FBC North Regional Catalyst Gary Townsend led the Conference, and we had nine (9) of our churches represented with six (6) pastors present. It was an informative meeting, and all agreed that the information shared was very helpful. Now, here we are. It is GCBA Annual Meeting time once again. We have planned a full program, beginning with a business session followed by a fellowship meal with a worship service to conclude the evening. (Thank you, Greensboro First Baptist Church, for agreeing to be our host.) But what do you say to sum up a year like we’ve had? The last 12 months have been crazy (remember: I’m from Chattahoochee so I know). If you would have told me that we were going to experience a pandemic like the one we’ve faced over the last 18 months, I would not have believed it possible. But we have somehow come through it. Or have we? I don’t know if we’re still in the beginning of this, somewhere in the middle, or hopefully at the end. Either way, I repeat what I wrote at this time last year: “I have no idea what the future holds, but I am glad to state with confidence that I know Who holds the future.” It is not science or the government or the medical community that I am trusting in (although each of those entities has a part to play in the struggle with COVID), my faith still holds in the One who created the heavens and the earth. He is still on the throne, and He is definitely still in control. This pandemic has not surprised him or overwhelmed Him. As Romans 8:28 tells us, He is continuing to work all things together for our good (if we love Him) and for His glory. Let’s recommit ourselves to the task, the honor, the great privilege we have of preaching Jesus and loving people. If we do, God will bless and we will see many men and women, boys and girls, come to know Jesus. As always, I remind you: we can do far more together than we could ever do alone. If I can be of service to you, please let me know.

## Moderator's Report

Jerry Chumley, is bearing fruit in many ways. The monthly pastor's fellowships have reconnected pastors with one another, which is a critical piece of equation. The increased financial support of our churches for the work of the Association is another sign that we are inching toward a healthy understanding of our interconnectedness. And the joy that is present when our sister churches connect with one another for training and fellowship points to an association that is becoming more reflective of the prayer of Christ.

We begin a new year in October, and with this new year come new opportunities. My prayer for this coming year is that we will grow in our commitment to reflect the gospel to our community, as well as grow in our commitment to share the gospel with our community for the glory of God.
